Pastor's Corner

In Matthew 1-2, we read about two kings: Herod and Jesus. The former was an earthly king. The latter is the Eternal King.

Herod ruled Israel and Judah from 37-4 BC. He was a master builder, constructing many theaters, cities, and fortresses. One of his construction campaigns was his own palace at Jericho. His most famous building project was the rebuilding of the temple at Ierusalem. He was known for being ruthless, murdering his own wife, several sons, and other relatives. In order to protect his throne, he ordered for "all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under" to be killed (Matthew 2:16). He was threatened by Jesus, the true King of Kings.

King Jesus was not concerned about protecting His own throne. Rather, Jesus willingly gave up His heavenly throne to come down to earth (Philippians 2:6-7). Unlike Herod, Jesus did

not need the comforts of a palace. Jesus traded in the splendor of glorious heaven to be born in a lowly manager (Luke 2:7). Herod surrounded himself with the wise counsel of chief priests and scribes (Matthew 2:4), while Jesus' first visitors were uneducated shepherds. Herod may have built an earthly temple, but Jesus truly brought God's presence to His people. He is Immanuel, God with us (Matthew 1:23). Furthermore, while Herod kills others for his selfish gain, Jesus allowed Himself to be murdered in order to save His people (2) Corinthians 5:21). And that's not even the end of the story. The king that killed others to save himself died from sickness in his palace while Jesus rose from the dead and reigns forever on His heavenly throne (Revelation 3:21). Though there are two kings mentioned in Matthew 1-2, there is no comparison. It is Jesus, the Eternal King, who is worthy of our praise.

This stark contrast between

Herod and Jesus teaches us this: Don't place your hope in an earthly king. Rather, place your hope in the Eternal King. Like Herod, earthly kings and leaders will let us down. Their actions are often selfish, deceptive, and temporary. On the contrary, Jesus rules with humility, in truth, and forevermore. Pray for your earthly kings and leaders (1 Timothy 2:1-2). They certainly need it! And give thanks to God this Christmas season because we have our Eternal King. He will never let us down. Merry Christmas!

Isaiah 9:6 - "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."
