#### Missions Report 2023 Kerrie Howard - NMI Vice President

As Vice-President, I write to you with a full heart. On behalf of our missions' council, I'd love to extend a huge thank you to you, Valley Chapel, for being so faithful to missions—in giving, in service, and, most importantly, in prayer!

In August, we were able to assemble 100 Pal Packs filled with school supplies for those who live in underprivileged areas. It was a true blessing watching individuals and families walk through the packing line, joyfully serving the Lord! By way of your donations, we were able to both assemble and send 100 packs, and because of your generosity, students now have the supplies they need to learn. Thank you!

Alabaster! In September, we collected dozens of little blue Alabaster boxes. Thank you, church, for being faithful in giving to the Alabaster offering. We raised \$2,025!

After the war struck Ukraine, we were able to raise and send \$11,000 to support those in need. This money was more than likely used to help refugee families find relief during an uncertain time. Thank you for your generosity.

We continuously pray for and support the Mann family, who serve in what they call "Switzermany." We were able to send a \$500 Amazon gift card as a Christmas gift from Valley Chapel.

This past October, we were blessed to host Jon and Shirley Fischer, missionaries in South America. What a blessing it was to hear from them. They partook in a wonderful meal with our seniors, spoke in Sunday school classes, and shared with us during our Sunday morning service. It was a special time.

We paid \$3,000 for deputation support for the Manns and Fischers, and we sent \$225 to support our Links missionaries and World Mission Radio.

Valley Chapel was able to send a missions' team down to Englewood, Florida in January. In partnership with Samaritan's Purse, our team was able to take part in the disaster relief efforts following Hurricane Ian. Some were able to "cut trees, remove debris, [and] take down water-damaged ceilings and walls," while others "cleaned and cooked for more than 150 volunteers" (Lynne Randolph). Our missions' team had countless opportunities to pray with those who suffered such great loss in Florida. What a blessing! God is on the move! Thank you for being a part of His mission.

### Treasurer's Report 2022-2023 Ken Kaiser - Treasurer

Church family,

As I started to reflect back on 2022 for the annual treasurer's report I found myself thinking about the following: What if Jesus asked me to write an annual spiritual report on myself from a personal perspective. A self analysis review if you will. What would that look like?

For those of you who keep a journal or diary I suppose that would be an easier task than for those (like me) who do not.

However, whether you are young or old, new Christian or older Christian, journal or no journal I suspect our reports would have many similarities because Jesus isn't so concerned with how much faith you have. He is concerned about who you place your faith in.

Our reports might mention victories, defeats, troubled times, why questions, feelings of regret or inadequacy, requests and answered prayers. But if our faith is in Jesus then we shouldn't find ourselves overwhelmed by the details. We will find ourselves moving forward because Jesus gives us strength and sometimes He carries us.

Some of us are just getting started on the journey, while others are farther down the road. Some may move faster than others. That's okay. We are never really done with our Christian walk.

If at the end of a year we find ourselves spending more time in prayer, more time in His word, being more like Jesus in our daily walk than at the beginning of the year then Jesus is pleased.

Paul said it best in Philippians 3:12 - 14 "Not that I have already attained or am already perfected, but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended, but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." We do these things, then our spiritual annual report will look pretty good.

Now, lets press on for a few reflections on the church finances for 2022. Thank you for continuing to give of your time, talents and financial resources under difficult circumstances.

The numbers listed below are through January 31, 2023. There are two months left in the fiscal year. Some highlights:

- 1. As of January 31, 2023 the overall tithes to the church was \$916,880. We are on track to meet our budgeted goal of \$1,027,468 To God be the Glory!
- 2. As of January 31, 2023 \$51,908 was given to support missions. To God be the Glory!
- 3. As of January 31, 2023 \$150,089 was given to the Common Fund. To God be the Glory!
- 4. We continue to aggressively pay down the mortgage which currently stands at \$1,455,969.

As of January 31, 2023 \$90,344.18 was given for debt reduction. 100% of this money has gone directly to the principal of the mortgage further reducing the interest charges. To God be the Glory!

The new fiscal year will no doubt bring new challenges to our families, our church, our jobs and our community.

The good news is Jesus has it. Lets press on to the upward call.

Praise God for His work in the hearts of our students!

This coming year, we are looking forward to bringing a record group of forty-three students to Berea Deep Freeze Winter Retreat. Also, we are so excited for Nazarene Youth Conference this summer where eighteen of our high school students will gather to worship with students from Nazarene churches all across the United States and Canada. Furthermore, in both our student ministry and young adult ministry, we continue to meet new people almost every week. What a privilege it is to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with them! Looking forward to what God has in store for the student and young adult ministries at Valley Chapel as we continue to point this generation to Him.



#### Trustees Annual Report 2022-2023 Ron Johnson - Head Trustee

We consider it an honor and privilege to serve the Lord in maintaining His properties this past year. Just as the Bible says, the Lord "owns the cattle on a thousand hills," the Trustees understand that He also owns Valley Chapel in Uxbridge, MA.

Beyond the normal repairs and maintenance required to maintain five (5) buildings totaling over 60,000 square feet of heated space, this fiscal year the Trustees were busy with several projects and improvements.

The Trustees' first order of business this year was to visit our parsonages and evaluate repairs and improvements needed. The Trustees take the responsibility very seriously of giving our anointed ministers warm and well-maintained living arrangements for themselves and their families. We completed 95% of those necessary repairs this year, including repaving two parsonage driveways.

This year we also prepared for pastoral moves and parsonage repairs associated with them. As you are away, last year's worship & Online Pastor, Josh Fox, accepted a call as Senior Pastor at Hartford City Wesleyan Church in Indiana. A team of mostly volunteers completed the work to ready the parsonage for our new Worship & Online Pastor, Matt Genese, and his family, who moved in on January 7, 2023. Praise the Lord!

Among Sanctuary projects undertaken this year were to award a contract to Superior Roofing Company to complete the sanctuary roof repairs work. The work was completed during the Fall of 2022. Improvements were also made to the café facilities, which now allow for additional seating.

After several meetings this year with the Lower Campus tenant, the Trustees have negotiated a mutually beneficial one-year lease with Precious One's Daycare Center. Also, regarding the Lower Campus, the Trustees plan to replace the 30-year-old furnace this year and are currently acquiring quotes for local heating contractors.

In closing, the Trustees would like to thank those volunteers (which includes pastors) who have given of their time and expertise to help keep Valley chapel running like a well-tuned engine. Trustees understand that these folks are giving of themselves as to the Lord, but we also want to thank them for their acts of love and kindness. This volunteer work is not going un-noticed!

# Pastor Josh Annual Report 2023 Pastor of Ministry Development - Josh Howard








# Do you ever feel lost and overwhelmed with no future for you and your family to look forward too?

Come help us tap the secret of God's word as we are instructed to feel and project ourselves in times of turbulence. We will discuss facts about Climate change from Temperature, CO2, Solar, Wind, Electric Vehicles and how it all relates to our changing world. What does the book of Revelation say on the subject of the world ending? Will it be Fact or Myth, come find out? We will certainly be discussing God's wish for peace for our future.
