Pastor's Corner



Back in June my family was able to attend the 30th General Assembly of the Church of the Nazarene in Indianapolis, IN. The GA happens every 4 years. The theme was Jesus is Lord. Having been a Nazarene my whole life, attending GA is like a really big family reunion. I saw friends from my college days, pastors from the New England District who have been

called to other parts of the country and this couple who attended Valley Chapel a few years ago. Bonus points if you can name them.



There were 6

worship services held during GA. The number of people in attendance ranged from 6,500 to 11,500! What an amazing experience to worship our Lord with that many voices.

The Church of the Nazarene is now in 164 countries world wide. Many people traveled from around the world to attend GA. During the Sunday morning service we prayed The Lords Prayer and were instructed to pray it out loud in our native language. There were so many different languages being spoken at once. It gave us a small taste of Revelation 5:9 "And they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain, and

Below are some quick recaps from the messages preached by our General Superintendents so you can see their hearts for God's Word and His people.

General Superintendent David Graves preached a message titled "Reckless Worship" "The only thing we can do is respond to His love," Graves said. "And how do we respond? We respond with our love, we respond with our worship because He first loved us."

Graves read John 12:1-8 about Mary breaking open the most expensive nard and pouring it on the feet of Jesus. The passage served as an illustration of the reckless things people do in the name of love.

"This action of Mary, this act of worship, this act of impracticality, is really the smell of reckless love that she had for her Lord," Graves said.

He pointed out that she had reason to love Jesus because she "knew the difference between the smell of death and disappointment and the smell of love" because of what Jesus had done for her brother, Lazarus.

"Her action, her worship, it's about giving," Graves said. "It's about honoring, it's about loving Jesus, and she's not seeking anything in return."


It is that type of love with which Graves encouraged the congregation to worship God.

"Let's join Mary in pouring out our worship to God," Graves said. "Understand that the reckless, passionate, priceless, extravagant fragrance that He wants to receive today is your love, your adoration, and your surrender to Him."

General Superintendent Gustavo Crocker message emphasized the importance of discipleship through the priesthood of all believers.

"The call to follow Jesus is a call to be transformed as agents of transformation to His likeness," Crocker said. "His task of redemption was completed at the cross. The task of the church is to announce the good news that it is finished." He reminded the congregation that the Church is to be a faithful expression of good news and that because Jesus is Lord, God has equipped the Church to fulfill the task of discipleship. Crocker alluded to this through Ephesians 4:11-12: "So Christ Himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for

works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up." "Whether you are lay or clergy, it doesn't matter. At the cross, the curtain was completely open. And now you and I are royal priesthood."

Sunday night's service General Superintendent David Busic charged the assembly to "shake the gates of hell." He gave a message inspired by Matthew 16:15-19, focusing on verse 18 where Jesus tells Peter, "...on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." He opened by recalling the roots of the Church of the Nazarene and the inspiration for the denomination's name. In biblical times, the village of Nazareth was a place no one wanted to be associated with, yet Jesus spent the majority of His time there ministering to the poor and oppressed.

"It was that vision that those early Nazarenes said, 'That is the Church we want to be known as,'" Busic said.

He went on to explain the difference between offense and defense, saying, "gates are defensive; gates are closed." "Jesus is giving us an image [in Matthew 16] of the church on offense, attacking hell, driving back its gates, and hell not surviving the assault," Busic said.

"Jesus is Lord, and Jesus said, 'I will build my church, and the gates of hell will not prevail against us," Busic said. "We are on offense. Go in the power of the Spirit now. Be the sent ones, the filled ones. Be the ambassadors of Jesus."

General Superintendent Carla Sunberg delivered the Quadrennial Address.

In her message, titled "Good Morning," Sunberg drew upon Phineas Bresee's traditional greeting of "good morning," which he would use to greet others no matter the time of day. "Bresee knew that it was always the hope of the morning, of the dawn of the light of the Messiah breaking into our dark world that would bring transformation," Sunberg said. "And this is our heritage, it is our DNA – it is the hope that the church had at Pilot Point that they could unite around this transformational message even when the world was divided."

She went on to share about the light that God has shown into the darkness of the world, including the growth Papua New Guinea experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic, a 166 percent increase in new Nazarenes.

Sunberg emphasized the work of Nazarene Compassionate Ministries in response to the estimated 100 million people displaced by war, famine, climate, and persecution.

In closing, Sunberg offered a challenge to the assembly to return to the DNA of Pilot Point. She drew upon John 1:46, where Nathan asks Philip, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?"

"Our world may be asking, 'Can anything good come from the Nazarenes?" Sunberg said. "And I would suggest — come and see."
